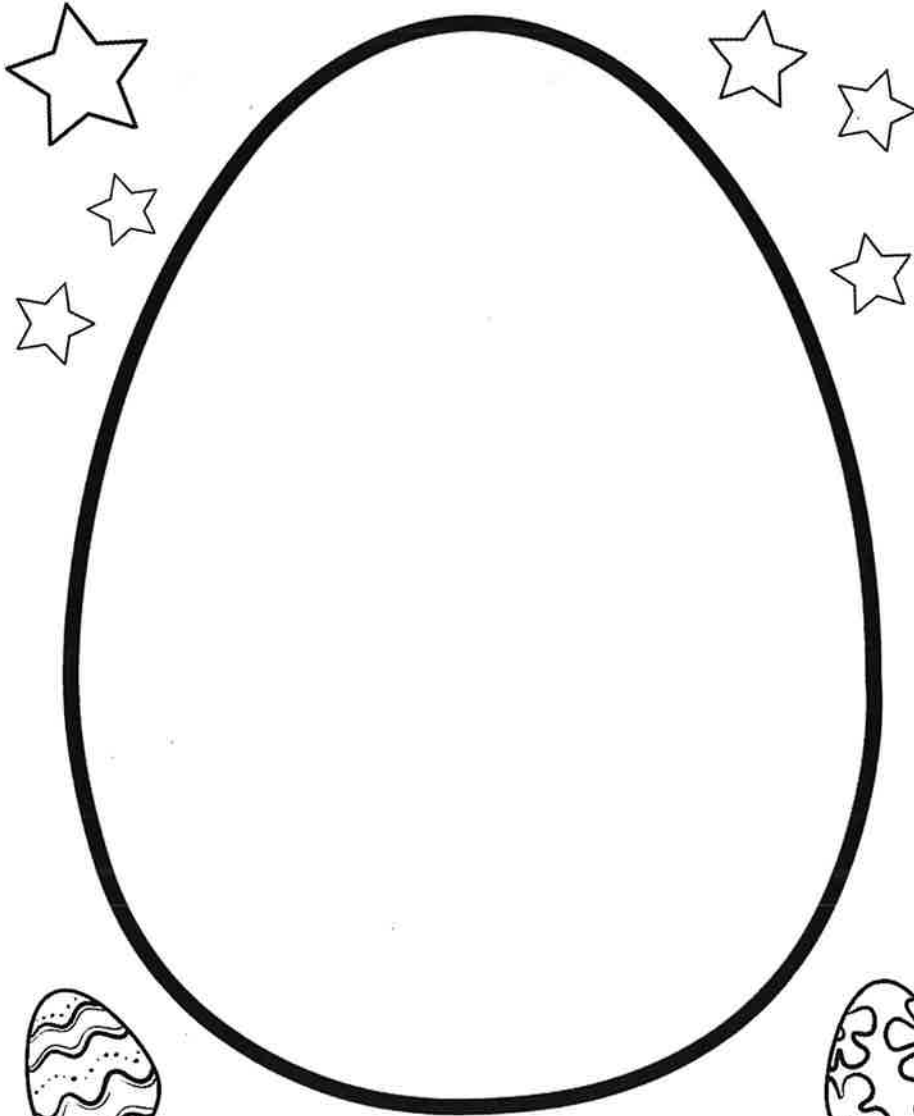


# DECORATE AN EASTER EGG

Write a paragraph explaining how your egg represents your town, or city. Why do you think it is the perfect representation of where you live?

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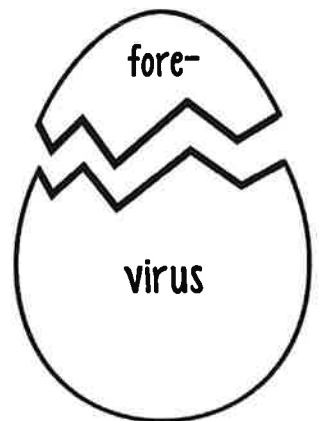
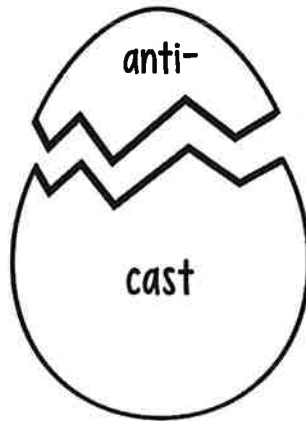
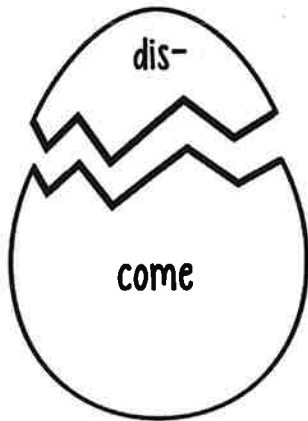
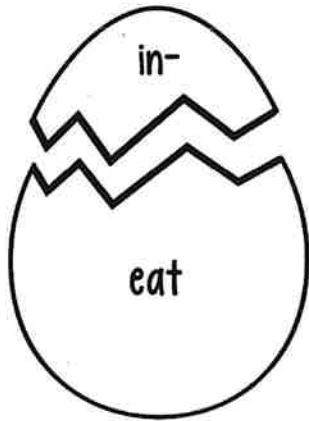
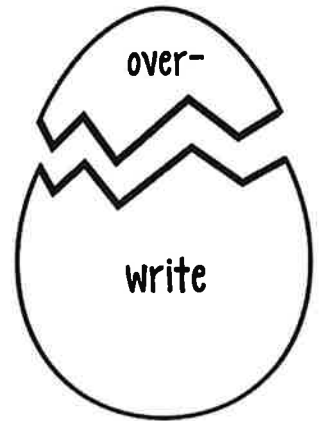
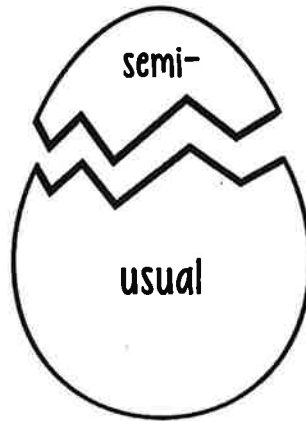
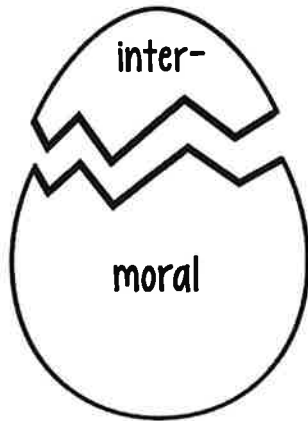
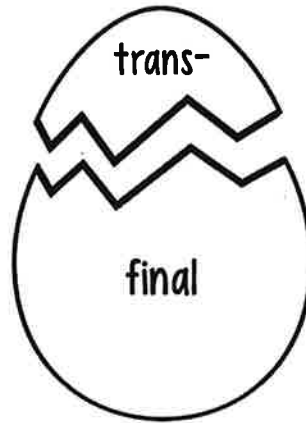
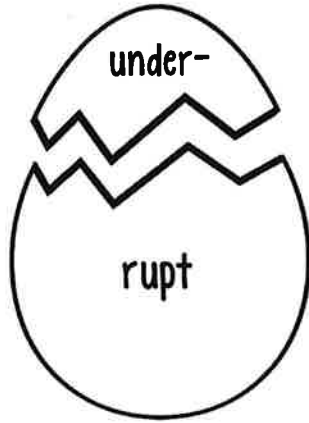
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# SCRAMBLED EGGS | PREFIX PUZZLES

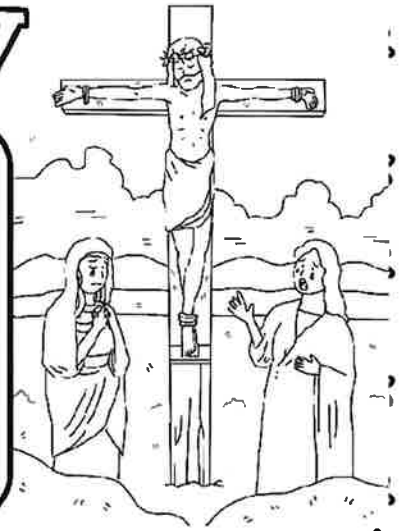

# The Easter Story

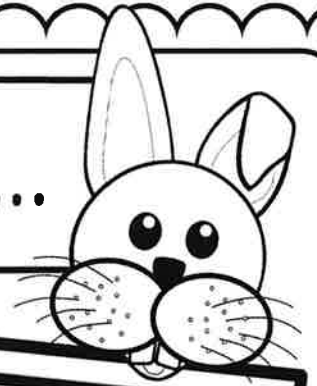

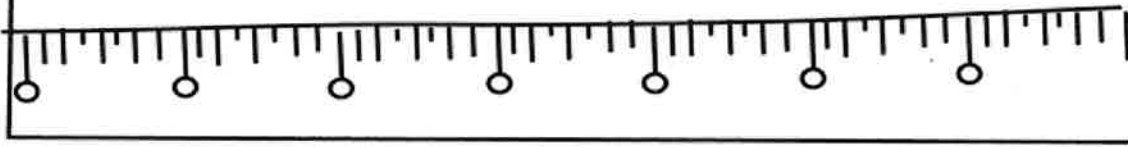

# The History of Chocolate



Read the History of Chocolate and then organise the facts and information in to a chronological timeline about the amazing history of chocolate.

The first chocolate bar is made by Quaker Joseph Fry in 1847.

In 1930, Snickers and Freddo are sold. Mars Bar also goes on sale in 1932.

A chocolate house opens, in 1657, in England where you can buy a drink of chocolate.

In 1905, Dairy Milk is introduced and sold.

Around the 1500's the Aztecs drink chocolate, rather than eat it, by mixing the roasted, ground cacao beans with water and flavoured with herbs or spices like chilli.

Milk chocolate is invented in 1875, by Henri Nestle, accidentally. The formula meant for babies, contained sweetened condensed milk.

Toblerone goes on sale in 1908. It was created by Jean Tobler, in its famous triangular shape, representing the Swiss Mountains where he lived.

In 1899, Queen Victoria sends every one of her soldiers, fighting in the Boer War, a chocolate bar.

The Ivory Coast in West Africa becomes the world's largest producer of cacao beans in 2000.

Swiss chocolatier, Jules Sechaud develops the filled chocolate bonbon in 1913.

In 1935, Aero and Kit Kat are created and sold.

In 1795, steam engines are used to grind cocoa beans making chocolate cheaper, as part of the Industrial Revolution.

Cadbury markets the first box of chocolate candies in 1868.

During the 1890's American, Milton Hershey, starts coating his caramel and candies with chocolate.

1941-1945: US military servicemen are issued with three, four-ounce chocolate bars.

In 1915 the Milk Tray is made and is available for sale.

In 1854, Cadburys receives a Royal Warrant to be the sole purveyor of cocoa and chocolate to Queen Victoria.

The Spanish bring chocolate back to mainland Spain during the 1500's. The taste is too dark and bitter, so sugar, vanilla and spices are used to give chocolate a sweet taste.

The first chocolate factory in America opens in 1765.

During the 1930's, Ruth Wakefield invents chocolate chip cookies after running out of baking chocolate.

1930: Snickers and Freddo go on sale. 1937: Smarties, Rolo and Milky Bar are also sold.

In 1921 Fruit and Nut goes on sale. In 1929, the Crunchie chocolate is also sold.

The Swedish biologist, Carolus Linnaeus, gives a scientific classification and botanical name, *Theobroma Cacao* to the chocolate tree in 1753. *Theobroma*, in Latin, means "food of the gods," while *cacao* refers to the native word for the plant.

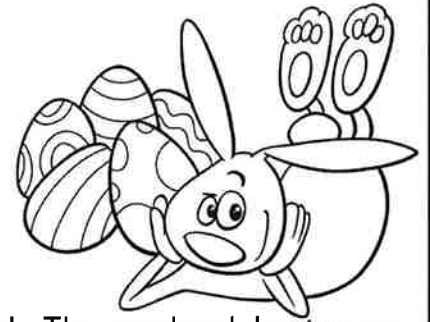

# EASTER AROUND THE WORLD

Easter is a time for celebrating new life. The date of Easter varies each year according to the phases of the moon. Many countries around the world celebrate Easter according to their own traditions and religious beliefs.

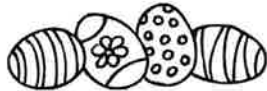


## Australia



In Australia we celebrate Easter over a four day long weekend. The weekend begins on Good Friday and ends with Easter Monday. Many Christians go to church on Good Friday or Easter Sunday. Easter Sunday is usually celebrated with the giving of chocolate Easter eggs and with chocolate bilbies instead of the traditional chocolate rabbit. Like rabbits, the Easter bilby has long pointy ears and fine fur. The bilby is our preferred creature in Australia because rabbits are often viewed as pests that take over the habitats of native animals.

## Greece



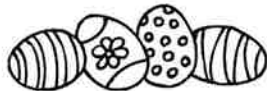
Easter in Greece is a very religious time, churches are decorated and processions are held. Eggs are painted red to represent the blood of Christ. Traditionally, when people meet they knock their eggs together and say 'Christos anesti!' meaning 'Christ is risen!' Many people also view the cracking of the eggs to be symbolic of Jesus breaking out of his tomb.

## Hungary



In Hungary, Easter is celebrated with the baking of delicious pastries and the painting of hardboiled eggs. Easter celebrations take place for more than a week in Hungary. Palm Sunday is called "Flower Sunday" and Good Friday is a day for housecleaning and decorating eggs. On Easter Saturday, Easter baskets are taken to church and blessed.

## Germany



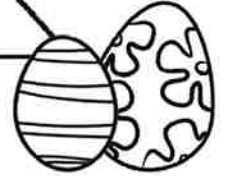
In Germany, Easter Sunday is known as 'Family Day'. Lots of sweet treats are eaten, including a cake shaped like a lamb and eggs and cookies are hidden in the garden. Many Germans also have an 'Easter Fire' where they burn their Christmas tree to show that winter is over and spring is coming. It is also popular in Germany to have an egg tree. Real eggs are painted and then hung from branches in a vase inside the house.

## China



Chinese people celebrate by offering eggs as gifts. These are no ordinary eggs though, they are beautifully painted and represent life, rebirth and fertility. The art of painting on eggs is part of the Chinese culture, where eggs are drained before being gently decorated with fine line art of women, sceneries and other images of beauty. The three symbols of Easter (eggs, rabbits and baby chicks) hold significance in the Chinese culture.

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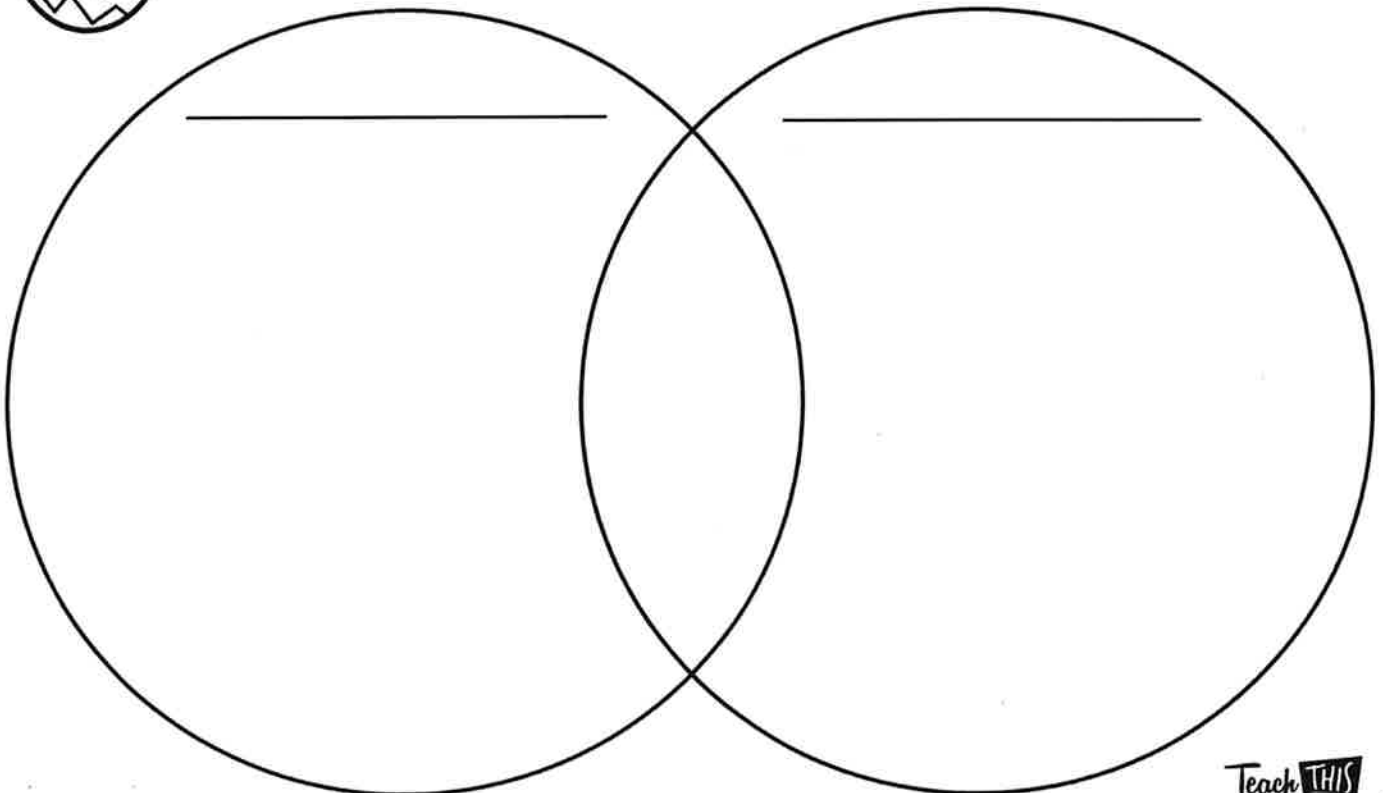
