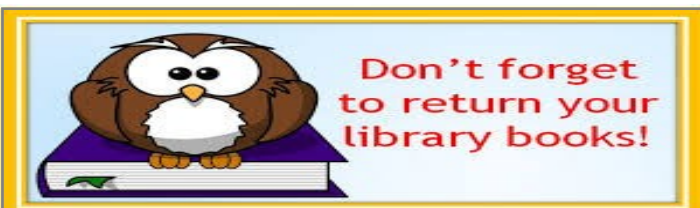
Respect
