HEAD LICE ALERT

There has been a reported case of head lice in our school. Generally, where one student has head lice this serves as a warning that there is likely to be an infestation in either specific classes or across the whole school population.

Please check your child's hair on a daily basis and if you find head lice or their eggs, treat them immediately. A commercial lice treatment (available from your local chemist or supermarket) can be effective, but you will need to read the label and follow the safety instructions carefully.

LATE TO SCHOOL

School commences at **9:05am**. Students arriving after this time **MUST** sign-in at the School Office with a note or phone call made to the office when dropping off your child so they can be marked as an explained late arrival on that day.

If they do not come through the office with an explanation for being late they could be marked absent for the whole day as the rolls are often already marked by the teachers before your child gets to class.

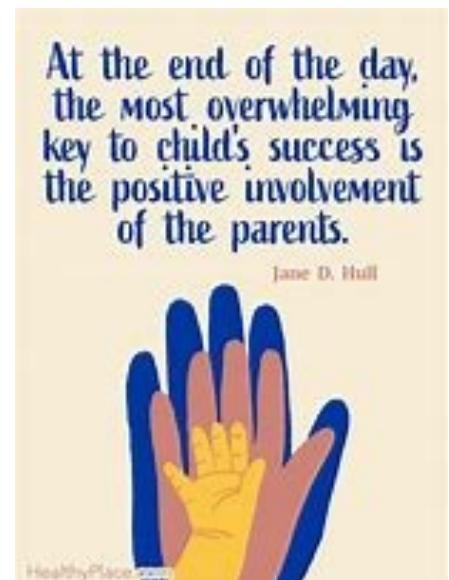
