


What to do:

Hold my hand every time we cross the road

A note for my family,

My class is learning more about road safety and crossing the road. Because I am young please:

- hold my hand whenever cars are or could be about
- talk with me about how to cross the road safely every time we cross
- practise crossing the road safely with me
- practise crossing at pedestrian crossings and at pedestrian lights.

Some things to talk about and practise:


- holding hands every time we cross the road
- if you can't hold my hand, making sure I hold your arm, clothes, bag or the pram or trolley.

When we cross the road talk with me about:

- looking for pedestrian signs and lights or other safer options
- stopping one step back from the kerb
- always stopping completely
- what we need to look and listen for
- how long we need to look and listen for
- what could stop us or make it difficult for us to look or listen
- waiting for vehicles to stop before stepping on to the road at crossings
- why we think it's safe to cross
- when it's safe to cross, walking straight across the road and checking for vehicles as we go.

At pedestrian traffic lights talk with me about:

- the red and green pedestrian signals and what these mean
- stopping one step back from the kerb when the red pedestrian signal is showing
- pressing the button and waiting for the green pedestrian signal to appear
- only ever starting to walk across the road when the green pedestrian signal is showing
- understanding that cars are supposed to stop when the green pedestrian signal appears but sometimes they might not.





Scenario 1

This family is going to the park to play some ball games together. There is no footpath for them to walk on and they will have to cross some driveways along the way.


- Where should they walk if there is no footpath?
- What are the dangers in and around driveways and how will they keep safe?
- Who will they hold hands with? How will they carry everything so they can still hold a grown-up's hand?
- Where will they cross the road? How will they choose a safer location?
- What will they need to do to keep safe while crossing?



Scenario 2

This family is walking home from the shops carrying their heavy shopping bags. They need to walk through the busy car park to get to the footpath. On the way home they need to cross the road at a pedestrian crossing and also at the traffic lights.

- What are the dangers in and around car parks and how will they keep safe?
- Who will they hold hands with? How will they carry the shopping so they can still hold a grown-up's hand?
- What will they need to do to keep safe when crossing?

Adults are always responsible for the safety of the young children in their lives.


